### **Public Information Meeting** **Port Darlington Shoreline & Flood Damage Centre Study**

Central Lake Ontario Conservation (CLOCA) and the Municipality of Clarington invite you to join their staff to discuss the launch of the Port Darlington Shoreline and Flood Damage Centre Study. The public meeting will take place at the Bowmanville Older Adults Association Centre, 26 Beech Avenue, Bowmanville on Sat., March 3, 2018. The doors will open at 8:30am with a presentation at 9:00am.

The purpose of the meeting is to work with the public and stakeholders in the development of shoreline management options. "The desire is to identify key areas of concern, issues and problem areas and receive input on desired outcomes for the shoreline," says the Mayor of the Municipality of Clarington, Adrian Foster. "The project has been collaborative to date, with CLOCA, the Cedar Crest Beach Working Group, the Municipality of Clarington and the Port Darlington Community Association stakeholders at the table." The meeting agenda will include a presentation by CLOCA and Aqua Solutions, offering the opportunity for further comments and discussion with those in attendance. Central Lake Ontario Conservation recently contracted Aqua Solutions to develop the study. Aqua Solutions consists of an expert team of coastal engineers to ensure an integrated understanding of the issues at the site.

"Input is a very important part of the process, and we look forward to meeting with the public to discuss the study," says Chris Darling, Chief Administrative Officer for CLOCA. "Part of the purpose of the meeting is to garner information on flooding and erosion issues which will feed into the study assessment."
