Central Lake Ontario Conservation is thrilled to be working with TD Friends of the Environment Foundation to host a TD Tree Days event on October 13<sup>th</sup> at the north entrance of Enniskillen Conservation Area (Carruthers Tract), 7780 Holt Road, Clarington. The event is free and will run rain or shine starting at 9:00am and wrapping up when the trees are planted or noon, whichever comes first.



**Volunteers of all ages** are needed to plant 300 White Pine Trees. This is a great opportunity for individuals, families, scout and guide groups, churches, businesses and students to make this world a greener place and enjoy spending some time in nature. **Anyone wishing to participate is asked to register online at [www.tdtreedays.com](http://www.tdtreedays.com).** Please dress for the weather, bring a hat, sunscreen, and wear sturdy footwear. All volunteers will receive a free TD Tree Days t-shirt and refreshments.

Not only are trees beautiful, but they provide a habitat for our wildlife, a carbon sink for climate change, absorb air pollutants, and help prevent erosion,” says Meagan Breems, coordinating these events on behalf of TD and CLOCA. “As these trees grow and mature, a retired farm field will return to a forest and become part of Enniskillen Conservation Area’s forest ecosystem.”

Since Holt road is not a through road, you will need to come south on Holt from Concession Rd 8 (Columbus Road). You will find the parking lot on the west side of Holt Road just before Holt Road is gated off.
