Subject: Notice of Hazardous Creek Conditions

The Central Lake Ontario Conservation Authority advises that the Surface Water Monitoring Centre (SWMC) of the Ministry of Natural Resources (MNR), is tracking a slow-moving low-pressure system set to move into the CLOCA watershed today through to Sunday. The system is expected to bring significant three-day mixed precipitation, with totals ranging from 20-60mm.

Streamflows have been slowly declining over the past week and are near seasonal levels. However, the combined precipitation, frozen ground conditions, and any associated remaining snowmelt will result in increased runoff causing higher than normal water levels and flows in our streams. **Widespread flooding is not anticipated, however fast flowing water and flooding of low lying areas and roadways may be expected in flood prone areas.**

The Central Lake Ontario Conservation Authority is asking all residents to stay away from all watercourses, shorelines, and structures such as bridges, culverts and dams. Increased wave activity, elevated water levels, fast flowing water, and slippery conditions along stream banks and Lake Ontario shorelines continue to make these locations extremely dangerous. Please remind children of these dangers.

**This Flood Outlook Statement will be in effect through Monday March 31st, 2025 or until further notice.** The Central Lake Ontario Conservation Authority will continue to monitor the conditions of the streams and will provide updates as required.
